The month of March saw Central Sector's proactive week. The purpose behind this is to work with our partners and try and tackle different issues within the community. Results have yet to be fully collated but activities undertaken included:

1 person arrested for a High priority Domestic Violence Assault and also on warrant.

1 person arrested for a High priority Domestic Violence Criminal Damage and assault.

2 persons arrested for possession of a Class C drug with intent to supply.

1 Person arrested for five offences of handling.

1 Person arrested for going equipped.

1 person arrested for conspiracy to Supply Class A Drug.

2 persons dealt with, one for possession of Class C drug and both for handling and proceeds of crime.

Numerous patrols of hot spot areas generating in excess of 54 stop checks.

Licensing visits and ASB patrols over three evenings with Trading Standards. Numerous amounts of alcohol seized.

Cycling proficiency work with local schools.

Patrols targeting the sex industry.

Truancy patrol.

Focus on traffic matters; tickets issued for mobile phone use, tax and seat belt offences.

As part of our proactive week, as some of you may have seen in the local press, we also held a football match against Swindon Central FC. This match was to begin to build a better, stronger relationship between the police and Asian youths. There have historically been issues between the two parties and it was a positive step to be able to hold the match in the first place.
